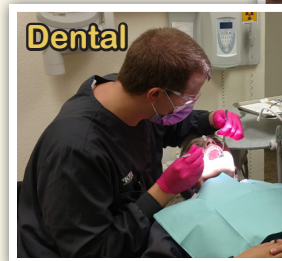

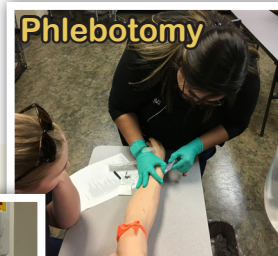

Career Training Programs are any classes or programs designed to help you find a job, enter a career, get a promotion or earn more money. They can be offered at Adult Schools, Technical Schools, ROPs (Regional Occupational Programs) and even Community Colleges. Often less than two years in length, many of these programs lead to a certificate, which can give you a competitive advantage in the job market. Most importantly, these programs provide hands-on training to prepare students for actual work in their chosen field.

Butte County CTE and ROP offers a variety of career training programs for adults ages 18 and up in Butte County. These programs do not require a college degree, are under a year in length and are for anyone seeking to get started in a new career.



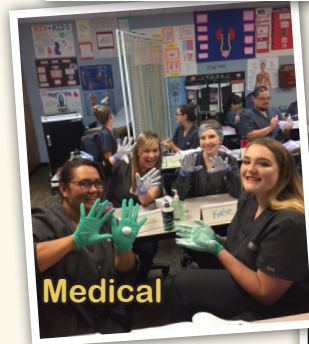

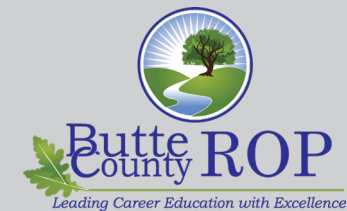

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# Our PROGRAMS



## \*MEDICAL ASSISTANT - ROP

This 38-week program (1080 clock hours) prepares students with the necessary manipulative skills, technical knowledge and experience for entry-level employment as an Administrative Medical Assistant and a Clinical Medical Assistant in a doctor's office, medical clinic or health care agency. Students successfully completing this program are eligible to sit for the California Certifying Board of Medical Assistants exam in Administration and Clinical areas.



## \*REGISTERED DENTAL ASSISTANT - ROP

This 34-week program (980 clock hours) prepares students with the necessary manipulative skills, technical knowledge and experience for entry-level employment as a Registered Dental Assistant. Students successfully completing this program will receive six RDA certificates (see website for details) and be eligible for the Registered Dental Assistant Examination offered by the Dental Board of California.



## \*CERTIFIED VETERINARY ASSISTANT - ROP

This 24-week program (600 clock hours) prepares students with the necessary manipulative skills, technical knowledge and experience for entry-level employment as a veterinary assistant, animal caretaker or kennel attendant. Students successfully completing this program may earn 6 units toward the Veterinary Technician program at Yuba College and are eligible to sit for the California Veterinary Medical Association (CVMA) Certified Veterinary Assistant exam.



## PHLEBOTOMY TECHNICIAN I - ROP

This 11-week program (106 clock hours) prepares students to draw blood specimens from patients as requested by hospitals and referring physicians. Students successfully completing this program are eligible to sit for the National Exam for Certified Phlebotomy Technician and apply to become a California State Certified Phlebotomy Technician.



## PROFESSIONAL WELDING ACADEMY

This 8-week academy provides participants the opportunity to learn basic skills while preparing for welding-related employment. The curriculum combines classroom instruction with hands-on application. National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER) welding certifications are available.
