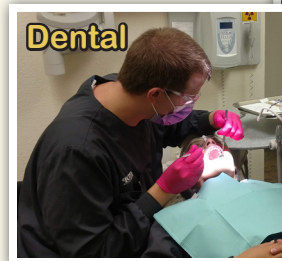

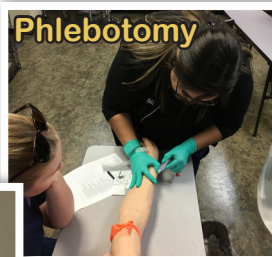
In 1974, the Butte County Office of Education established the Butte County Regional Occupational Program (**Butte County ROP**). The intent was to develop a career technical education delivery system that would provide skill training and career guidance with work-based learning opportunities appropriate for Butte County adults.

Since then, **Butte County CTE** was created to house career technical education (CTE) services which include our Butte County ROP programs as well as CTE leadership development, technical assistance, K-12 career education and CTE teacher mentorship. In addition, Butte County CTE collaborates with industry and workforce development agencies to offer personalized training programs.

Butte County CTE offers a wide variety of career programs and services for adults in the county. These are intended for anyone seeking a new career, a career focus, or upgrading of current skills.



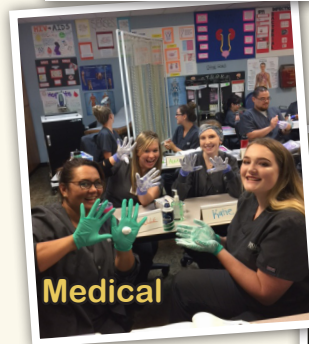

Our PROGRAMS



*MEDICAL ASSISTANT - ROP

This 31-week program (820 clock hours) prepares students with the necessary manipulative skills, technical knowledge and experience for entry-level employment as an Administrative Medical Assistant and a Clinical Medical Assistant in a doctor's office, medical clinic or health care agency. Students successfully completing this program are eligible to sit for the California Certifying Board of Medical Assistants exam in Administration and Clinical areas.



*REGISTERED DENTAL ASSISTANT - ROP

This 34-week program (980 clock hours) prepares students with the necessary manipulative skills, technical knowledge and experience for entry-level employment as a Registered Dental Assistant. Students successfully completing this program will receive six RDA certificates (see website for details) and be eligible for the Registered Dental Assistant Examination offered by the Dental Board of California.



*CERTIFIED VETERINARY ASSISTANT - ROP

This 24-week program (600 clock hours) prepares students with the necessary manipulative skills, technical knowledge and experience for entry-level employment as a veterinary assistant, animal caretaker or kennel attendant. Students successfully completing this program may earn 6 units toward the Veterinary Technician program at Yuba College and are eligible to sit for the California Veterinary Medical Association (CVMA) Certified Veterinary Assistant exam.



PHLEBOTOMY TECHNICIAN I - ROP

This 11-week program (106 clock hours) prepares students to draw blood specimens from patients as requested by hospitals and referring physicians. Students successfully completing this program are eligible to sit for the National Exam for Certified Phlebotomy Technician and apply to become a California State Certified Phlebotomy Technician.



PROFESSIONAL WELDING ACADEMY

This 11-week academy provides participants the opportunity to learn basic skills while preparing for welding-related employment. The curriculum combines classroom instruction with hands-on application. In the last two weeks of class, students will have the opportunity to gain real-world, on-the-job training through participation in our "Community Classroom."
